As we approach the end of the summer term we will be preparing our children for the move to their next year group. Staff have worked very hard to make sure that children have been placed in classes that meet their personal, social, emotional and academic needs. A letter will be sent home next Friday giving you information of who your child's class teacher(s) will be and where the classroom will be situated.

We will then ensure that children have time to spend with their new class and teacher prior to them spending a full day with them on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> July.

On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> September and Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> September there will be open afternoons where parents can work alongside their child, meet the teacher and have a brief presentation of the year ahead. These will start at 2.30pm and will finish by 3.20pm. Long term curriculum maps will also be sent home on these days. Teachers will be around until 4pm to answer any additional questions or meet parents who have siblings in other classes.

Massive congratulations to our Girls Football Team who competed at The Hampshire Games yesterday. They represented our school extremely well, showing great 'sporting' behaviour to other teams – Mr Peters, Mrs Kelly and all the staff at Shamblehurst are extremely proud of them. ## Shamblehurst Remember the fallen of World War I

Following another very moving visit to the Lochnagar Crater, during the Year 6 residential to France last July, a second plaque has now been placed in the name of Shamblehurst.

Both plaques were organised following donations collected from the children, for purchasing a CD of all the trip's photos. The children were visibly moved by the enormity of the loss of life that occurred not only at Lochnagar, but at all the war graves and sites that were visited.

This second plaque is particularly poignant as it remembers a lady who died on the last day of the war, but whose grave has been subsequently 'lost.' She is, therefore, sadly not remembered anywhere, except in the national book of remembrance. Her name was Josephine Crilly and she was a 36 year old nurse.

The first plaque that was laid has actually now been relocated, so our two plaques are side by side. In case anyone ever has the chance to visit the Lochnagar Crater - and it is most definitely worth a visit - they can be found in plank Section K. (The sections run alphabetically, in a clockwise direction, from left of the cross and the brick plinth).

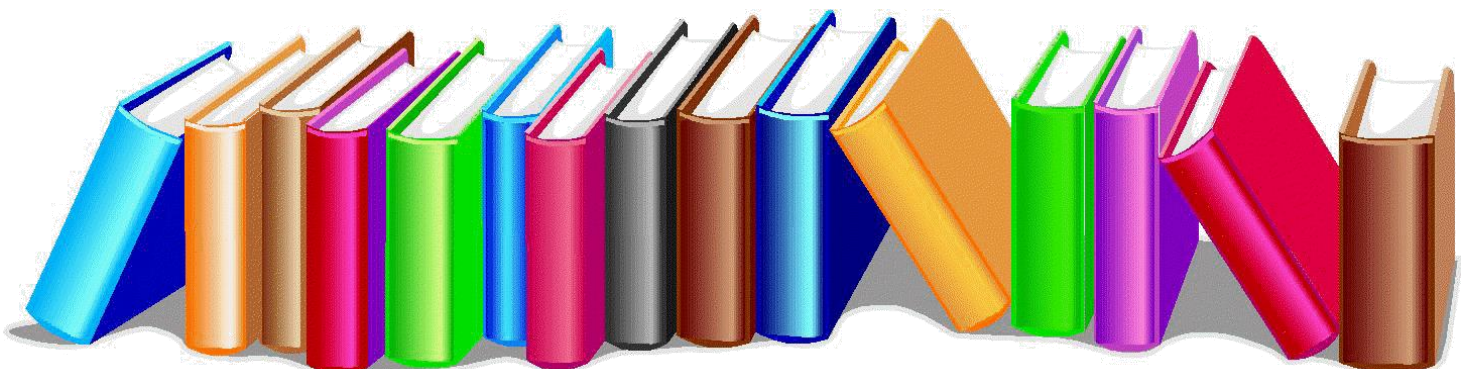
