



Christmas Performance Tickets



On Tuesday 28th November, a team of boys and girls from Year 6 took the short trip over to Hamble to compete in a sports-hall athletics event. They battled against Freegrounds, Berrywood, Botley and Hamble primary schools.

First, they took part in a range of field events, which saw Dillon Fenner winning his foam javelin event, Sophie Kent came third in the standing triple jump, and Ethan Fowler finished first in the boys vertical jump, whilst George Grove came third in the boys standing long jump.

Afterwards, the running events took place. The atmosphere was electric as all five schools competed in several high intensity races including the 1, 2 and 3 lap sprints; followed by the team relays.

The team had great success in both individual events and team relays. Ethan Fowler and Jasmine Phillips both picked up first place tickets in their respective sprints. George Grove, Eva Perraton and Sophie Kent picked up second place tickets in theirs. Amisha Malhotra and Ethan McIntosh took third place in the two lap and one lap sprints. Dillon, Ryan, Nathan, Marietta and Georgia also all placed well in their respective races.

The girls 2 x 2 lap relay saw Megan Hurst and Sophie Kent take third position and a very gallant effort from Amisha, Georgia, Jasmine and Eva saw the girls just miss out on third in their 1 x 1 lap relay. The boys 1 x 1 lap relay, ran by Ethan F, Ryan, George and Nathan saw the boys win by over half a lap! Ethan M and Dillon ran extremely well also, to achieve third place in their 2 x 2 lap relay.

So, after a very successful and competitive evening the squad ended up finishing third place overall. They all performed extremely well and they did themselves and the school proud.
