



All children receive in KS1 receive Universal Free School Meals

Year 3 - Year 6

Unless your child is entitled to Free School Meals, school dinners cost £2.15 each day and dinner money must be paid on the day of ordering, or in advance. There should be no outstanding debt on children's accounts.

If you think that you may be entitled to Free School Meals, please collect a form from the letter rack in the office.

If your child is going to be absent from school, please ensure you contact the office, either by phone, absence message or email, to provide us with a reason for absence. Please ensure you contact us each day of absence. Unfortunately, if we do not hear from you and Mrs Curry is unable to contact you, this will result in an unauthorised absence being marked.






