
Parents/Carers will develop:

- Knowledge about brain development.
- Better understanding of their child's condition.
- Strategies to help their children manage their anxieties, behaviours and impulses.
- Skills to improve their children's emotional health and well-being.

The course will be run on Tuesday mornings from 9:15am to 11:45am, starting on Tuesday 23rd April 2019, the first morning after the Easter holidays. It is a 12 week course that runs every week (not half term) until Tuesday 16th July 2019.

We are the school councillors and today we have come together to discuss many matters that have crossed our minds. Here are some examples of the topics we have been exploring in our meetings.


- The use of our reading diaries. We have constructed a questionnaire to gather our classes thoughts.
