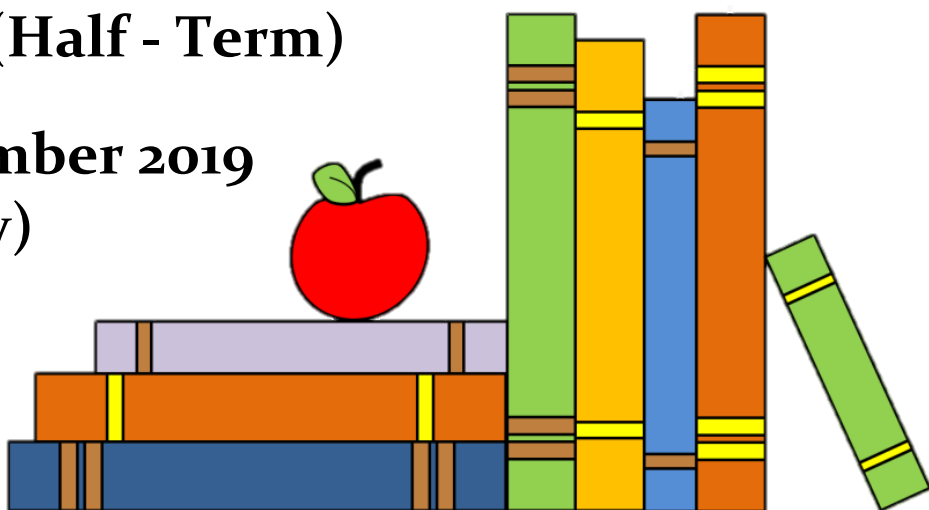

Healthy Lunchboxes

Shamblehurst promotes healthy eating. A balanced, healthy, nutritious diet is important for the development of a child's physical state, as well as for their intellectual abilities.

Please note the following recommended guidelines set out by the British Nutrition Foundation.

A child's lunch should include only the following:

- A portion of starchy food, eg. wholegrain bap/bread, pitta bread, plain crackers, pasta or rice salad
- Fresh fruit and vegetables, eg. apple/orange/banana, cherry tomatoes, carrot sticks, mini fruit chunks, etc
- A portion of milk or dairy food, eg. cheese, plain/fruit yoghurt, etc
- Small portion of lean meat, fish or alternative, eg. two slices of ham, chicken, beef Quorn, cheese, tuna, egg or hummus, etc
- A drink - fruit juice (not fizzy), water (not flavoured), milk (not flavoured)

Water Bottles



We would like to remind parents to send their child to school with a named water bottle.

We have a large number of children who request a plastic cup each day, so that they can have a drink in class.

These are to contain water only. Flavoured still clear water is also permitted.

E-Safety Safety Update



We are pleased to attach with this newsletter the first of our monthly e safety newsletters. It is a great resource for parents trying to keep their children safe online. It provides information on the current trends children are following as well as tips on how to make using the internet safer. In addition to this, it has links to articles which contain more detailed information in case you want to know more about the games your child is playing on their device.

Two particular highlights in this month's edition are some information on Fornite and how to turn off the chat functionality. The link to the Parentzone website also talks about the Privacy settings available, which can ensure your child does not play with anyone they do not know personally.

The second thing to highlight is a link which may be useful to anyone who has sky broadband. Sky Broadband Buddy is an app which allows a parent to set different levels of filter to any home devices. It also enables you to set time limits, scheduling an 'Off Time' for the different devices as well as monitor what each user has been doing online.

Should you have any Esafety concerns regarding suspicious behaviour or if you need general support then [saferinternet.org](https://www.saferinternet.org) has links and advice on who to contact. We are currently in the process of adding an Esaftey tab on our school website which will contain all of this information.

Well done Joe!

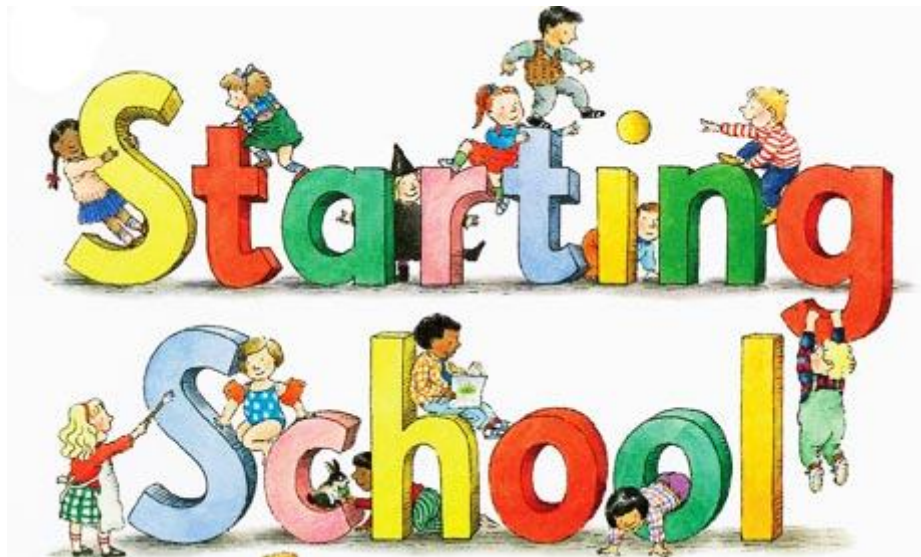
Miss Bruening
