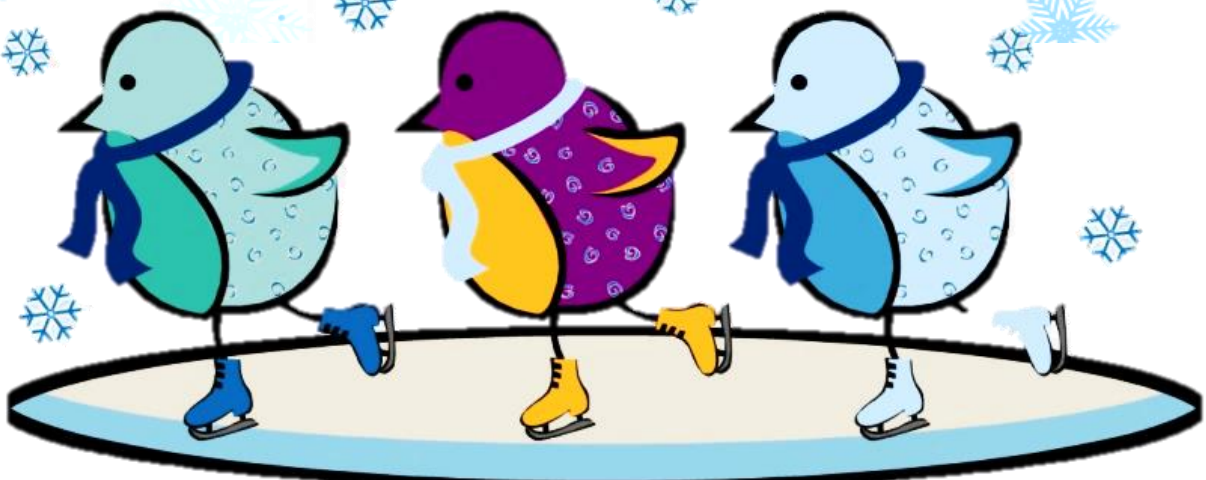

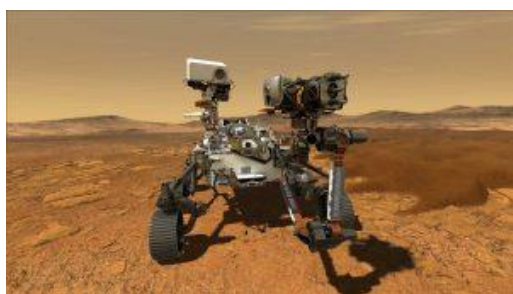

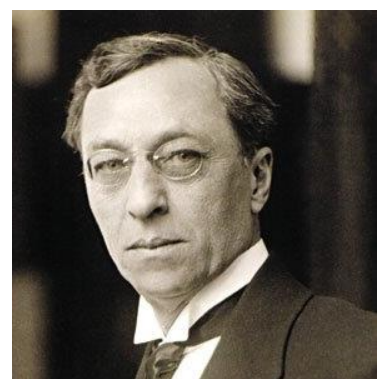
Year 1 - Outcome

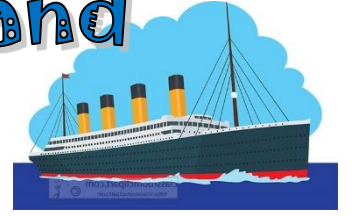

Year 2 - Titanic Day and Sea City Trip

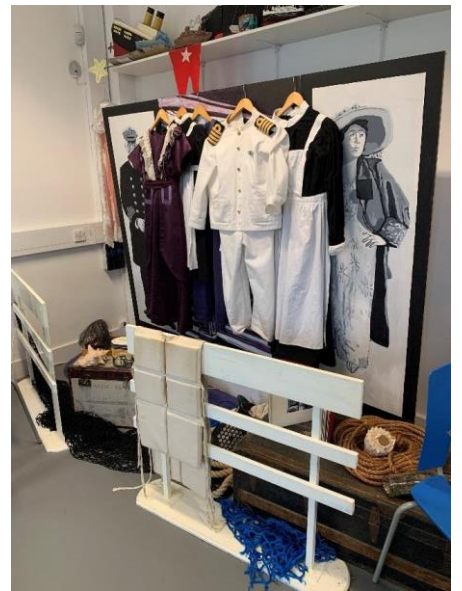

Depression consumes me. Anxiety imprisons my soul. Vulnerability annihilates my hope. This is what happens to me everyday in this hell hole of a prison. I am being buried in a pit of eternal suffering. But today was worse. My entire body went numb, as a guard gleefully told me that my son, my gorgeous child, died in a car accident. I can't even say goodbye...

This same catastrophic event happened last year as my mother passed away. Once again I am in a hole that I can't dig myself out of. I cannot believe that these people can trap me in here while my family is dying!

I have spent some time thinking how I could have been better for them. All I have are the memories of my past, like his first steps,

his first words and playing hide and seek like I used to do. Those are all lovely memories of the good times I had, which were suddenly cut short, never to be repeated.

The worst part of prison is the simple things that people use everyday: a private bathroom, clean, glowing water and a comfortable bed. All these things that people take for granted are what I miss most in my insane adversity.

I try to remain positive as I sit in my cramped cell. I shall not let this loss break me down but use it to rise up against those who try to crush me. I am stronger than these things that weaken me to my knees. INVICTUS!

Dear Diary,

Depressed! Devastated! Despair! Tormented! Hurt!

These are just a few of the emotions that I'm feeling. The cell walls (which are very convincing) feel like they will collapse on my soul and take all the calm out of me. I realize now that my cell is my torment.

My heart shattered, as the guard took great satisfaction in telling me that my son, my delightful boy, has just been tragically killed in a car accident. It feels like someone has thrown salt into my invisible scars. I'm not even allowed to attend his funeral.

Only a year ago, my dearest mother died, I wasn't allowed to visit her for the last time either. Imagine not knowing about the world, where you can't say your final goodbye to your family, where you only have memories: this is my heartbroken life. It feels like someone has stabbed me with the knife of heartache. I'm trying my best to suppress my anger. Why? I ask myself. Why? Do these monsters or guards have any emotion?

It's the small things that I long for the most. The question is: will I ever get them back again? I am a man without the sun, without love, without friends, without family, without much fresh air. In short - a man without anything people cherish the most.

Imagine a place where your head and feet touch the walls, where your bed is a cloth, where there is no privacy: this is my reality. Lonely, isolated, tormented - will my torture end?

It's a life of waiting, a life of yearning, a life where you want the sun of equality to shine down on you again. The tragic event of my my delightful boy has given me more strength. I am again determined to honour the people I have lost on my incredible journey to freedom, choice, grace, will and rights; my noble son. This place and these people. They will not overthrow me.

The only thing I want to say is: INVICTUS!

I've spent my time mostly mourning that I am here permanently and that this is now my life. I have realised I must find

The hope through the concrete prison.

I miss my family; I miss the sand in the palm of my hand; I miss the forest; I miss the fresh air; I miss the drinks; I miss the sun and I miss the comfort, but those are just decaying memories now. This world is just and dreadful, however, in the darkest of places there is always hope. Someone is using the ugly powers of racism to drag me away from the rays of equality.

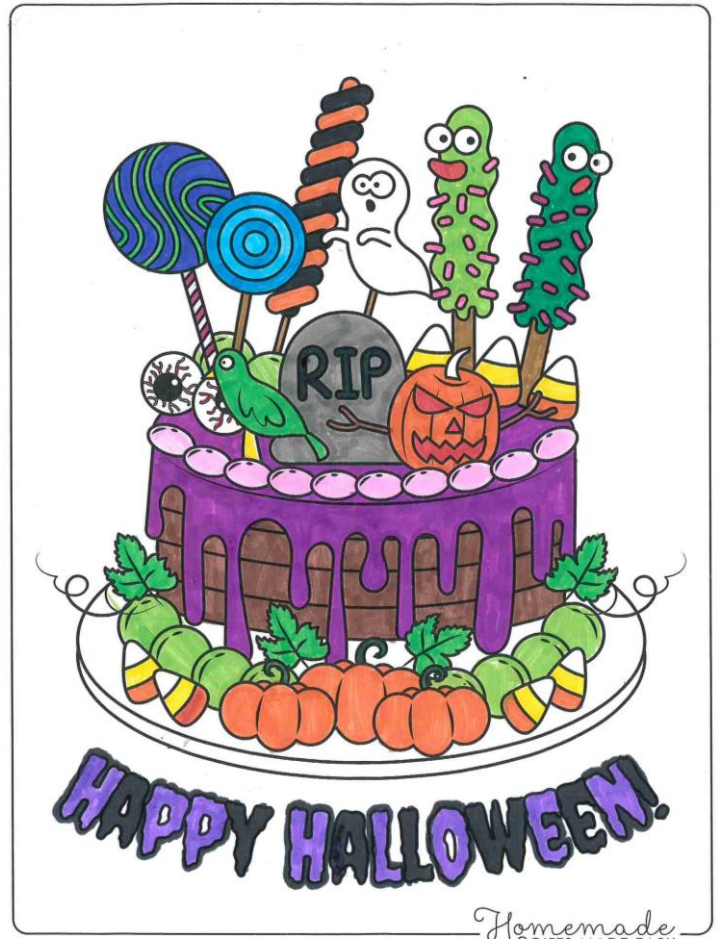

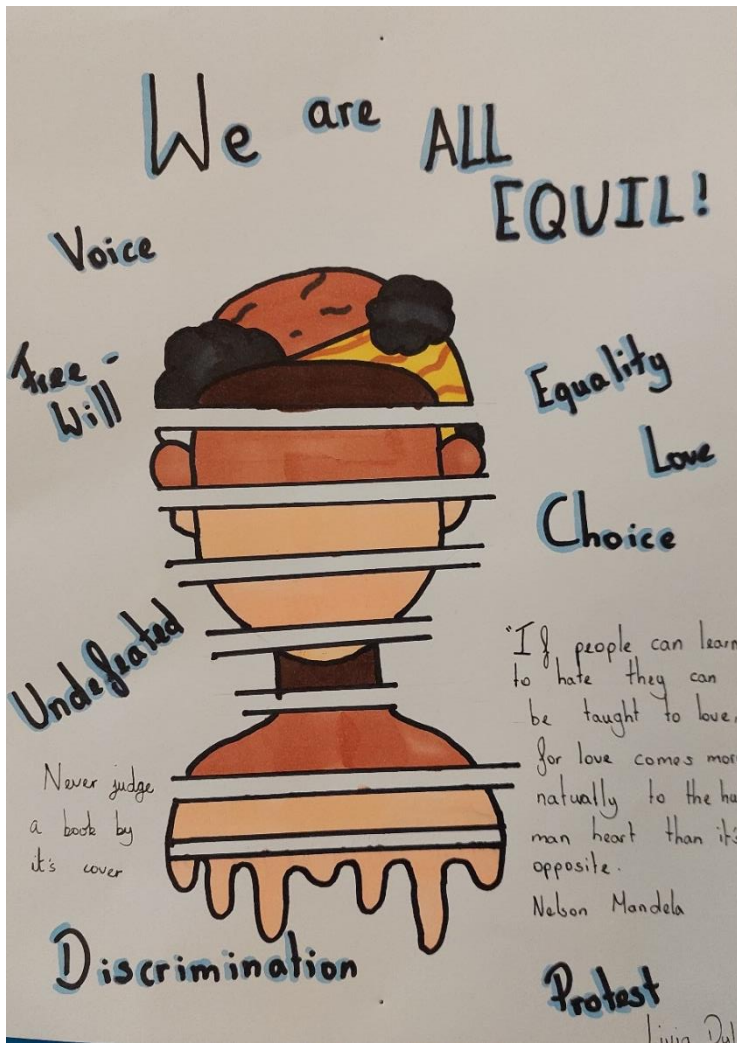
