Over and Above – Recognition.

Recognition Board – celebrating achieving the identified learning behaviour. Changed when needed for the class. **Celebration Assembly** – Celebration Certificates given out in assembly and mentioned in our newsletter. This is based on recognising a pupil's individual brilliance that week.

Marble Jar – celebrating whole class behaviours 20 marbles (these are given out for following the 3 school rules). Rewards are given to the children when they have filled the marble jar. These rewards are chosen by the class. House Points – 1 house point at a time - these are given out across the whole school to children in their house teams for: excellent learning behaviours; effort in learning; being a great ambassador for the schools 3 rules. **Above and Beyond** – we send post cards home which recognise children who have gone way above and beyond.

Relentless Routines consistent across the school:

Morning Routines

- Enter the school grounds and be prepared for learning.
- Staff meet and greet on entry to the classroom.
- Morning tasks are set up for the children to settle down to learning.
- Register and lunches.

Stepped Sanctions

- Reminder
- Caution
- Last Chance
- Time out (Reflection Room at Break).
- Follow up • (restore and repair).
