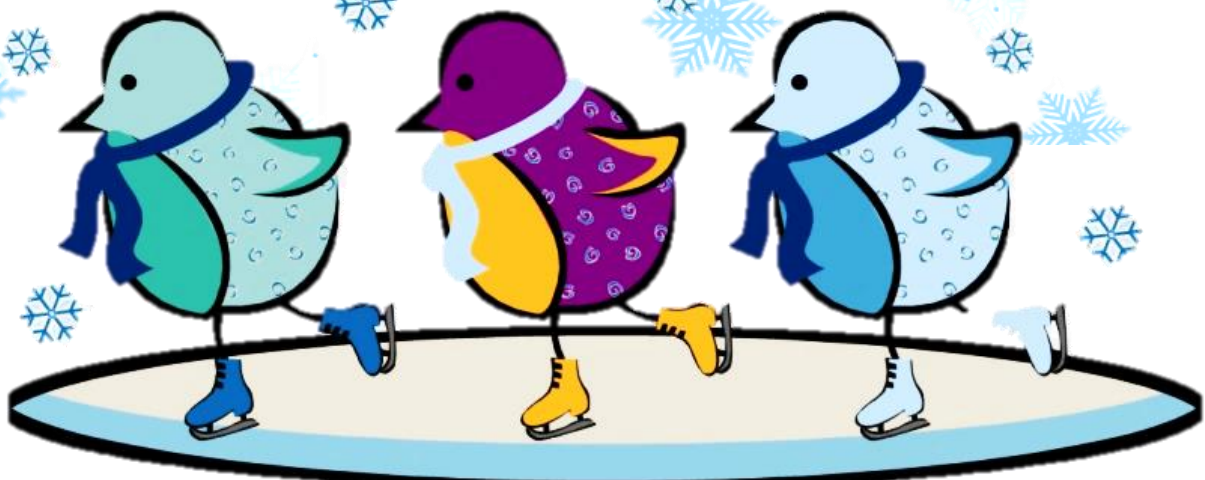

Year 1 - Art Gallery Outcome

In Year 1 we created our own art gallery for our grown-ups to come and enjoy. This was to showcase all of our beautiful art work from the Autumn Term. In our gallery was a mixture of individual art pieces and some larger collaborative pieces. We had studied three main artists over the Autumn Term, those being Yayoi Kusama, Henri Matisse and Wassily Kandinsky.

Yayoi Kusama, a Japanese artist who is still alive today aged 94, loved pumpkins and also to cover things in spots. We created digital art on the iPads and designed our own spotty pumpkins. We also made pumpkins out of clay. We even covered a mannequin in spots because Yayoi also covered people in spots and even a horse! We worked together to create a large collage which was inspired by Matisse. Matisse was a French artist who became famous for his large paper cut outs. One of his well-known pieces of art was called 'The Snail'. After practising our colour mixing skills to paint large pieces of paper, we cut out shapes to make art in the style of Matisse to make our own individual version of 'The Snail'. Kandinsky was our final artist we studied. He was a Russian artist who is known to be one of the first abstract artists. He was also believed to have 'synesthesia'. He saw colours when he heard music and heard music when he painted. The children worked together in our learning garden listening to music and creating their giant art piece with shapes and lines.

A huge thank you to everyone who came to support our gallery. It was very much appreciated.





The Nest Price increase from 15th April 2024

This was a difficult decision to make, as we appreciate the effect it can have on our parents. We thank you for your understanding and support during this change.

Year R went on a walk to the Hedge End Library. The walk there was about road safety and looking at our local environment. The children then visited the library to enjoy the love of reading and see the selection of books that were available.



Year 4 - Sustainability Centre Trip

Year 4 visited the Sustainability Centre to be immersed in all things Anglo-Saxons. We met Sean the Saxon, who showed us lots of artefacts and told us all about clothing, weaponry and life as a Saxon in general. He showed us how to make fire from scratch and modelled the strength of chainmail armour.

We learned about how the biggest fear for Anglo-Saxons was starvation, so the children were set to work killing rats and getting rid of crows!

After lunch, we made willow fences, and became archaeologists piecing together bits of pot found in the ground. We then studied Saxon pot patterns and produced our own using clay and hazel twigs.

It was a freezing couple of days, but we had the best time and learned loads!
