Don't forget FOSSA are organising our wonderful Mother's day Shop on Friday 8th!

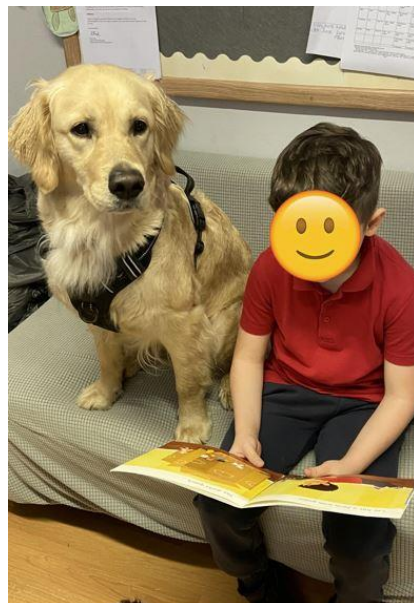

This includes Nutella in sandwiches!



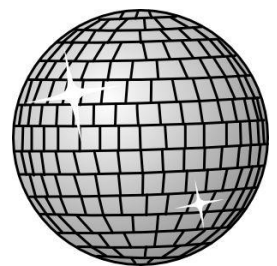

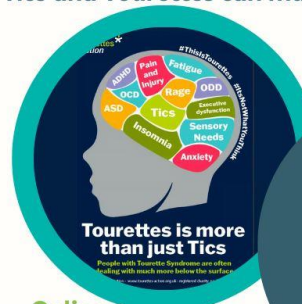
