


There is still lots to look forward to before we break up, Stubbington in Year 5, Sports Days and the Shamblehurst Summer fayre on Monday 21st July to name a few.

# Year 2 - Hiller Gardens

On Thursday 8th May, Year 2 went on a trip to Sir Harold Hillier Gardens. The focus for the day was Science and in particular, plants. The children were amazing and had the best day. We could not have asked for better weather conditions. Not too hot, not too cold! After exploring the vegetable patch and wormery, we headed to do some pond dipping. We found all manner of wildlife, including newts and dragonfly larvae. We then had a wonderful walk through the gardens looking at the different varieties of trees and plants from around the world. This led us to the herb/ sensory garden, where we collected different herbs such as mint, rosemary, chives, lemongrass and curry leaves. Lunch was a rest stop on the grass in the sunshine. After lunch we played some games including a seed survival game where we worked in teams to see what things in nature may stop seeds and plants growing, for example, people stamping on them, too much rain, animals nibbling them and not enough rain. We ended the day role playing a story about a plant and learned a bit about bee pollination. A really fun day!


